The W.A. College of Agriculture – Morawa, for the second year running, has won a Top Public School Award for 2007.

Ranked 18th in the State for Vocational and Educational Training the College also won a Certificate of Excellence from the curriculum council for Yr 12 student Darren Harris.. Darren, from East Binu, achieved more than 10 A grades in his final two years of school. He was also awarded the Dux of 2007 and received the Citizenship award from the College.
