

# Top School Award

The WA College of Agriculture Morawa has been recognised as one of the Top 50 Best Performing Public Schools for 2006. This included winning a Certificate of Excellence and achieving 100% Graduation.

College Captain Debra Johnson was awarded the Certificate of Excellence by the Curriculum Council of W.A. for achieving straight A results in all subjects over the two year course.

The College ranked equal 1st place in achieving 100% graduation, 14<sup>th</sup> in the state for Vocational and Educational Training, and 34<sup>th</sup> place for Wholly School Assessed subjects.

Nationally Recognised Training in Construction, Agriculture and Automotive is delivered by the College in industry standard workshops. Vocational Training excellence has resulted in the WA College of Agriculture in Morawa becoming a school of preference for discerning students.

Principal Mr Craig Chadwick credits the achievement to concerted capacity building over the past few years. "An Agricultural College provides an atmosphere conducive to learning", he said. "Together with dedicated staff delivering quality programmes, a culture of excellence has been developed. All credit must go to the students for their attitude towards learning".
